NOVEMBER MEETING PRESENTATION

Batteries and Solar Power For The Shack (and Portable Operations!)

Presented by John Ailport, K7BSV

Ever wonder what it would take to run a 100-watt class station including your computer(s) for 24 hours on battery power backed up with a solar charging system? Our own *John Ailport, K7BSV*, will be giving us the lowdown on how to make that happen at the November meeting of the Bonner County Amateur Radio Club. Please come and learn how to size your batteries and your solar panels. Although there are 12-volt computers and monitors, most of us have systems that require 120 VAC for operation. John will give some tips on how to keep those computers and monitors running while on "battery power" through the night.

The program will include information on:

- ♦ Types of batteries-lead acid, AGM, deep cycle, LiFePO4
- ♦ Calculations on how much battery (amp hours) you need for various applications including use with inverters for radio use.
- Portable solar panels you can use to keep the batteries going if the power goes out; and how many watts do you need.
- ♦ Charge controllers.
- ♦ Controlling RFI from the equipment.

We encourage you to attend in person but as is our new routine, we will also stream the presentation on Zoom.
