Another Field Day is in the books! What a successful event and great turn out! Every Field Day has its challenges and this one was no different. Early on participants had to sort through issues with interference between the Digital and GOTA stations and then just as members were sitting down for the amazing taco bar dinner, power went out in the building! But we persevered and bested ourselves from last year! Preliminary results are looking fantastic - 265 Phone QSOs, 259 digital QSOs, and 54 GOTA QSOs. With the addition of 1,990 bonus points, we are looking at a grand total of **3,668 points**! By comparison, last year we scored a total of 2,550 points. The big difference was probably due to having a GOTA station and the dramatic increase in Digital activity. 

Pico Balloon Launch

After successfully launching a test balloon on July 9th, BCARC members gathered again in the Selle Valley on July 16th to launch their official Pico balloon - K7JEP-11. With near perfect conditions, you could feel the excitement in the air as the balloon slowly ascended, rising over the valley and clearing the mountains! After tracking the balloon via APRS.fi for nearly 7.5 hours and reaching over 26,000 ft in altitude, it started a fairly rapid descent near Glacier Park in Montana and ultimately lost contact near Hornet Mtn. While the team was hoping for the balloon to ride the jet stream and circumnavigate the globe at least once before returning to Earth, they don't consider this a failure by any means. In fact, they consider this quite a success for their first time out and a great learning experience. Plans are already underway for another launch in the near future.
