Field Day 2025....need your feedback!

Two options were presented to the Club at the November meeting, regarding the direction for Field Day 2025. The BCARC Field Day team is planning to slim down the logistical efforts with meals and related items, and would like feedback from club members on the style of operation.

Option 1: Continue the process we have used for the last two years of trying to do better than the previously year in total points. That means maximizing time on the radios for the full 24 hours and operating to maximize QSO's per hour. Typically for the operators that will involve a lot of time on one frequency calling CQ and quickly handling QSOs. Also means planning and working to get all possible bonus points and strong attention to antenna placement, interference between stations, etc.

Option 2: Focus our efforts on encouraging participation and helping our members become better HF radio operators. There would be less/little emphasis on points and more one learning and practicing radio operation skills and things like tuning in stations which are difficult to hear and practicing skills in making contacts.
